I hope everyone had a great Christmas and thank you very much for your gifts and cards. Once again, this will be a very busy term with a range of activities.



<u>Literacy</u>

As in previous years, we will cover many areas of literacy – writing, reading, spelling and grammar.

This term we will be focusing on different writing genres- argument and debate, biographies, plays and poetry, narrative stories and biographies.

We will continue to read a range of genres, classbased guided reading activities and will be concentrating on the skills of retrieving information, skimming and scanning and writing detailed responses.

There will be a weekly spelling test based on the requirements of the National Curriculum.

<u>Numeracy</u>

We will follow the usual units of work, but with a particular emphasis on number processes and application of knowledge through problem-solving. We will also be covering work relating to various measures including time.

To help in this area we will have regular tables tests and mental maths tests.



Creative Curriculum

This term our unit of work will be about the Victorians. We will look at the life and times of Queen Victoria, the Industrial Revolution, the lives of the rich and poor and many other aspects. We will use many techniques and formats to investigate this period of historyliterature, art, DT, cooking, films, music and much more!!

A visit to the library or some time on the internet to do some personal research would benefit greatly in order to complete their own independent project (letter to follow).

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<u>Science</u>

- To plan different types of scientific enquiries to answer questions, including recognising and controlling variables where necessary.
- To take measurements, using a range of scientific equipment, with increasing accuracy and precision, taking repeat readings when appropriate.
- To record data and results of increasing complexity using scientific diagrams and labels, classification keys, tables, scatter graphs, bar and line graphs
- To use test results to make predictions to set up further comparative and fair tests.

This term we will be looking at Words of Wisdom from the perspective of a variety of religions and from our own personal point of view.
