We have renamed our classes this year

Class 2—Year 1 and Year 2 are called: PATHFINDERS CLASS They find a Way! - are innovative, decisive, creative, independent

Class 3—Year 3 and Year 4 are called: ADVENTURERS CLASS They make it Happen! - are brave, risk-takers, resilient, prepared

Class 4—Year 5 and Year 6 are called: NAVIGATORS CLASS They lead the Way! - are leaders, apply skills, are over-comers, focused

Our Curriculum is 'knowledge rich'; provides specific skills for each subject; focuses on attitudes and values. There is full coverage of The National Curriculum.

The intent of our curriculum is that it is forward thinking and progressive. We want to show clear connections between subjects so that pupils can clearly navigate their way through the curriculum by recalling previous knowledge to guide them in their new learning stages. Conflict: Sharing; behaving responsibly; keep the peace; stop fighting


Conservation: Looking after things; being thoughtful; developing global awareness; thinking big
