| The risk of children being drawn into terrorism assessed | Staff can demonstrate a general understanding of the risks affecting children and young people; Staff can identify individual children who may be at risk of radicalisation and how to support them; There is a clear procedure in place for protecting children at risk of radicalisation. The school has identified a Prevent Lead, Nicola Fountain, Headteacher; The school exercises due diligence in relation to requests from external speakers and organisations using school premises All staff have read Keeping Children Safe in Education The Prevent Lead has trained staff in their duties as set out in The Prevent Duty (DFE June 2015); All staff have read the updated Safeguarding Policy which includes a statement regarding the school's Prevent Duty. All staff understand how to record and report concerns regarding risk of radicalisation; Staff complete a log of concern about a child's welfare as they would do for any other Safeguarding issue. All staff know who the Prevent Lead is and that this person acts as a source of advice and support. The Prevent Lead has informed staff about signs and indicators of radicalisation through Safeguarding Training and Prevent Duty Training All staff and Governors have completed on-line Prevent Training The Prevent Lead & Safeguarding Governor completed face-to-face Prevent training with Sean Arbuthnot – SMA Training on the 6th June 2017 |
| Prohibit extremist speakers and events in the school | Request an outline of what the speaker intends to cover; Research the person/organisation to establish whether they have demonstrated extreme views/actions; Deny permission for people/organisations to use school premises if they have links to extreme groups or movements. Provide justification for their decisions in writing. |

Northamptonshire has been identified as a Tier 3, low-risk area with some examples of Far Right and Islamic extremism in the past The designated safeguarding lead and Governor have undertaken Prevent Awareness Training on the 6th June 2017 (Sept 2015 and 2016). Prevent Lead provided advice and support to other members of staff on protecting children from the risk of radicalisation; All staff have completed the General Awareness Training on Channel; |

| Building children's resilience to radicalisation | Ensure that pupils have a "safe environment" in which to discuss controversial issues. Pupils develop "the knowledge, skills and understanding to prepare them to play a full and active part in society". Through PSHE/Citizenship, Circle Times and other curriculum activities, pupils are able to explore political, religious and social issues. Pupils are taught about the diverse national, regional and ethnic identities in the UK and the need for mutual respect.
